EU/Smart Regulation: The Regulatory Fitness Programme (REFIT) for lighter EU regulation:

On 2 October 2013, the European Commission published the results of the screening of its Regulatory Fitness Programme to make EU legislation simpler and lighter, as 74% of European Union citizens believe that the European Union's legislative acts generate too much "red tape" and are too burdensome.

The European Commission outlined the progress made so far and highlighted that Smart Regulatory principles have been mainstreamed into all the policy areas under the European Union's competence. Also, it mentioned the different legislative proposals it tabled and the initiatives it undertook to make regulation simpler to understand, adopt and implement. Some of these include reforms under Data Protection legislation and the Recognition of Professional Qualifications.

The European Commission's goal under REFIT is to avoid unnecessary administrative burdens and costs by making its legislation simpler. For this, it recognizes the need to boost co-operation between the European Union and Member States and with other European Union institutions. Because Smart Regulation should not be a "one-off initiative" but rather a guiding principle for better EU regulation, it should be embedded into the European Union's policy cycle and decision-making process.

ESBA Opinion:

ESBA Welcomes the Commission's initiative, as smart regulation and administrative burden reduction in particular have been high on our members' agendas. European legislation often comes with substantial implementation requirements which is both costly and resource intensive. There are great differences in terms of resources and ease of compliance between large companies and SMES. Even within the SME spectrum there are substantial discrepancies. What can be perfectly manageable for a company with 200 employees can be detrimental to a company employing 2. Let us not forget that 92% of all EU businesses are micro-companies with less than 10 employees. The Commission's Regulatory Fitness Programme helps ease the disproportionately heavy burdens on Europe's smallest. We urge the Member States to give the Commission their fullest cooperation in this approach.

IN BRIEF

EU/Internal market: European Commission adopts communication evaluating national regulations on access to professions.

On 2 October 2013, the European Commission has adopted a communication which evaluates Members States' regulations on access to professions. The aim of this exercise is to level the discrepancies between Member States regarding access to regulated professions. The Commission believes that young people are dissuaded to take up regulated professions, both in their own Member State and abroad, because of stringent conditions as well as discrepancies in national rules. The executive foresees an increase in employment and in GDP as effects of alleviating and leveling regulations across the EU.

EU/Enterprise: European Commission publishes shortlist of candidates for the European Enterprise Promotion Awards 2013.

On 30 September 2013, the Commission's DG Enterprise and Industry announced that a shortlist of candidates for the European Enterprise Promotion Awards 2013 has been selected. A diversified jury of representatives from business, academia and governments shortlisted 19 projects over 6 categories. These categories include Promoting Entrepreneurial Spirit; Investing in Skills; Improving the Business Environment; Supporting Business Internationalisation: Supporting the Development of Green Markets and Resource Efficiency, and Responsible and Inclusive. The Award ceremony will be held in conjunction with the SME Assembly in Vilnius on 25 November this year.

EU/Transport: Germany calls for lighter fuel efficiency standards.

On 27 September 2013, during a meeting of the EU Competitiveness Council, Germany presented a proposal to delay the goal of reaching 95 grams CO2 emissions for passenger cars to 2024. By 2020, 80% of national fleets would fall within the standard, whereas the remaining 20% would be eased in over a 4-year period, 5% each year respectively. Though beneficial to German car manufacturers, the proposal destroys compromises reached by the Irish Presidency. Critics report that the lowered ambitions will lead to 104g/km in 2020 and a further drop to 100g/km in 2022 before reaching the goal of 95g/km in 2024.

EU/Internal Market: Businesses damaged by misleading marketing practices.

On 26 September, the Internal Market Committee and Consumer Protection (IMCO) adopted recommendations on misleading marketing practices. In Europe, more and more businesses are victims of misleading marketing practices, causing several damages particularly to small companies. The report by Rapporteur Mr Cornelis de Jong MEP (GUE/NGL, NL) highlights the effects of bogus business directories on European businesses, engendering losses of billions of euros and recommends several potential solutions to this problem.

EU/ Budget: ITRE committee approves consolidated text of Horizon 2020 and COSME.

On 26 September 2013, the European Parliament committee on Industry, Research, and Energy (ITRE) voted on the adoption of the consolidated text of the Competitiveness for Enterprises and Small and Medium Enterprises (COSME) programme for the years 2014-2020. The committee also voted on the adoption of the consolidated text of each report within the Horizon 2020 package. All have been adopted by a large majority. The expected budget for the two programmes is € 77bn for Horizon 2020 and € 2bn for COSME respectively. The final vote in the European Parliament will take place after the approval of the Multiannual Financial Framework discussions.

EU/Transport: Eurovignette: New method for measuring road tolls.

On 16 September 2013, European Commission Vice-President Siim Kallas held a press conference at the International Road Transport Union (IRU) in Vilnius (Lithuania). Mr Kallas stated that the European Commission intends to change the road pricing method from a time-based to a distance-based system. The aim of these measures would be to simplify Member states' notification and reporting requirements, introducing new values for infrastructure and external costs and ensuring greater transparency as well as non-discriminatory rules for tolling schemes.
